June 14, 2020 - The Gift Goes On

Acts 2:22-41

- (V.22) The "miracles, signs and wonders" proved Jesus is Messiah.
- (V.23) God purposed to bring about the sacrifice of Jesus.
 - "Wicked men" = lawless = Gentiles = Roman authorities & soldiers.
- (V.24) God raised Jesus.
- (Vv. 25-28) From Psalm 16 a messianic passage by King David.
- (Vv.29-31) Peter explains how the passage applies to Jesus Messiah.
- $(\underline{V.32})$ **God** raised Jesus, and those believers gathered in the upper room had personally experienced the risen Lord.
- (V.33) Jesus the Messiah is exalted to God's right hand.
- Only the Exalted One has the power and authority to pour out God's Holy Spirit.
- (Vv.34-35) Another validation of Jesus from David (from Psalm 110).
- (V.36) Peter has been building up to this moment.
- The resurrection and exaltation of Jesus validates the Lordship of Jesus over mankind and the Messiahship of Jesus over Israel.
- (V.37) They were taking ownership of their actions and their sin.
- (V.38) In the early church, repentance and baptism went hand in hand.
- As soon as a person repents and puts their faith in Jesus they receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
- $(\underline{V.39})$ Salvation and the gift of God's Holy Spirit is for ANYONE and EVERYONE who will respond to God's call to faith and repentance.
 - Peter in V.21 and Paul in Romans 10:13 quote the prophet Joel.
- $(\underline{\text{Vv.40-41}})$ "Corrupt" = Greek is skolios = bent, warped, crooked meaning evil, perverse, unrighteous; because they had rejected Jesus. (John 1:11)
- Those who believed what Peter preached about Jesus acted on it through repentance and baptism.
- A person may hear the truth, but they then must believe it and act on it to be saved.
